Jamele Hill, a commentator on the sports channel ESPN, has been suspended for two weeks after she made a second violation of the company's social media guidelines when she urged viewers to boycott the Dallas Cowboys' advertisers. This was because the owner of the team announced that any player that refused to stand respectfully for the national anthem would be benched. He said: "Stand for the anthem or sit for the game." Last month, Hill tweeted that President Trump was a "white supremacist".
