



Hundreds of African Migrants Storm Spain's Border, Guards Face Knives and 'Unusual Violence'

Ceuta and Melilla, are Spanish territories in North Africa, the EU's only land borders with Africa, allowing passage from Morocco. An estimated 400 migrants charged the border in the early hours of May 6th, with only six making it across to claim asylum. A city official reported that guards were having to contend with young, physically fit migrants using "hand-made knives" and willing to deploy "unusual violence" to achieve their aim.

Hundreds of African migrants have attempted to storm border fences separating European Union territory from Africa in the Spanish exclave of Ceuta, resulting in several injuries.

The perimeter of the small city on the coast of North Africa, along with its nearby sister city of Melilla, shares the only land border of a European Union member-state with an African nation – namely Morocco – and illegal migrants have long seen it as a shortcut into the wider EU which bypasses the Mediterranean, or more circuitous routes via [the Black Sea](#) and [Russia](#).

The Europa Press [reports](#) that some 400 migrants charged the city in the early hours of May 6th, with 150 making it past Moroccan security forces to attack its outer fences.

The Spanish authorities told the news outlet that mobile units of the Civil Guard were deployed and a majority of the would-be intruders “repelled”, with just six managing to make it onto EU soil, three of whom were immediately transferred to the local University Hospital to be treated for injuries sustained on the fences.

EU law does not allow member-states to simply detain such migrants and deposit them back on the other side of the border; they must be allowed to lodge an asylum claim, and are typically allowed to roam freely while these are processed.

20% of the US Prison Population, 36,889 Inmates, Are Criminal Illegal Aliens

US Federal Bureau of Prisons (BOP) statistics show that 20% of prisoners in the US are criminal aliens. The total US prison population is 183,220 inmates, and Mexicans comprise the largest number of illegal alien criminal inmates with 23,532

prisoners, or 12.8% of the US prison population.

The United States having a significant foreign national population residing within the nations boundaries, be they legally or illegally present in the country, unfortunately includes those who commit crimes.

The extent and impact of [foreign national crime](#) on the U.S. citizens and residents of this country is explicitly revealed by a simple search on the [U.S. Federal Bureau of Prisons \(BOP\) inmates statistics website](#) under the heading of [inmate citizenship](#).

Here are the countries of origin, moreover, the number and percentage of those countries citizens recently incarcerated in the U.S. BOP prison system (The most recent BOP crime numbers available were from May 26, 2018.).

Inmate Citizenship:

- México 23,532 inmates, 12.8 percent;
- Colombia 1,677 inmates, 0.9 percent;
- Dominican Republic 1,461 inmates, 0.8 percent;
- Cuba 1,156 inmates, 0.6 percent;
- Other / unknown countries 9,063 inmates, 4.9 percent;
- United States 146,331 inmates, 79.9 percent;

Total Inmates: 183,220 inmates.

To clarify the meaning of these preceding criminal alien inmate numbers and percentages, I will translate them into words:

Combining May 26th BOP criminal alien inmate numbers, there were 36,889 criminal aliens in the BOP prison system.

Rand Paul Is Blocked from Ending Indefinite Detention of Americans

Republican Senator, Rand Paul, is trying to end the US government's power to indefinitely detain Americans, because it violates the constitutional right to a speedy and public trial. He is seeking support for a new Authorization for Use of Military Force (AUMF) Act, because he sees the existing version as a blank check for costly and unfettered war. In the meantime, he has introduced an amendment to the existing bill to partially achieve his objective. The inclusion of the amendment in the GOP package to be attached to the new military spending bill requires consent from all senators but is short by one vote, believed to belong to Senator Lindsey Graham. Graham, a retired colonel, in the past has supported indefinite detainment and has opposed limiting the president's ability to conduct war without the consent of Congress. -GEG

Sen. Rand Paul (R-KY) wants to end the U.S. government's ability to detain people indefinitely, arguing that it violates Americans' Sixth Amendment rights to a speedy and public trial.

He has proposed an amendment to the yearly, must-pass defense legislation authorizing Pentagon spending that would repeal a 2012 provision giving the president the ability to indefinitely detain anyone based on the 2001 Authorization for Use of Military Force (AUMF).

Paul, a Libertarian, has long-pushed for Congress to approve a new AUMF, arguing that it is a blank check for costly and unfettered war.

However, sources suspect that Sen. Lindsey Graham (R-SC) is

secretly blocking the amendment from being included in a package of GOP amendments that would be voted on and attached to the defense bill, since its inclusion requires consent from all senators.

“It is inconceivable that in 2018, a senator would block language to prevent indefinite detention of Americans. What happened to the rule of law? Lindsey Graham should own up to this and explain to innocent Americans why he’s fine with detaining them indefinitely,” said a senior Senate aide.

Breitbart News reached out to Graham’s office to confirm whether it was true, but did not receive a response on that specific question.

Graham, a retired colonel, has in the past supported the ability to indefinitely detain those captured under the current AUMF and has opposed limits on the president’s ability to conduct war.

But Paul argues the law currently would also allow American citizens apprehended within the boundaries of the U.S. could be held indefinitely without trial.

“Giving the accused their day in court isn’t a suggestion,” Paul said in a [statement](#) to the *Washington Examiner* last year. “It’s enshrined in our Constitution as a cornerstone of our judicial system. My bill reminds our government that the Founders did not put an expiration date on the Sixth Amendment.”

Trump Rattles G7 Meeting with Irreverent Actions and Words

Quebec, Canada: Trump has angered the other leaders at the G7 conference by insulting Justin Trudeau, skipping the climate-change discussions, canceling a meeting with French President Macron, showing up late to a gender-equality breakfast, and suggesting that Russia be re-admitted to G7. Trump surprised German Chancellor Angela Merkel (and everyone else) when he floated the idea of scrapping all tariffs, barriers or subsidies. [We are mindful that President Trump's decisions and appointments cannot be predicted by his impromptu actions and words.] -GEG

President Trump's 24 hours in Quebec while attending the annual G-7 Summit was [every bit as confrontational](#) as we imagined they would be. The president has enraged his fellow world leaders, insulted Justin Trudeau, who's hosting the summit in Quebec and whom Trump repeatedly referenced as just "Justin", and skipped a meeting with French President Emmanuel Macron.

German Chancellor Angela Merkel has attacked him and vowed to challenge his "America First" trade agenda while also confronting him about his climate stance – something that might be difficult to do, since Trump [left this morning after he said he would skip](#) discussions about climate change Saturday night.

Trump also showed up late to a gender-focused breakfast meeting, billed by the event's Canadian organizers as a chance for leaders to "draft concrete actions for the G-7 to advance gender equality," according to [CBC](#). Isabelle Hudon, Canada's ambassador to France, was making opening remarks when Trump and a flood of press pool members arrived and interrupted her.

As Trump quietly took his place between Christine Lagarde,

head of the International Monetary Fund, and Lt.-Gen. Christine Whitecross, the Canadian head of the NATO college in Rome, Trudeau restated his welcome and Hudon repeated her remarks.

Then there were his controversial remarks. Early on, Trump suggested that the G-7 should consider readmitting Russia, which was kicked out in 2014 for its activities in Crimea. Trump instead blamed those on Obama. Also on Friday, Trump floated the idea of ending all tariffs and trade barriers between the US and its allies – a pitch that wasn't exactly expected, according to [Politico](#). Trump offered the proposal at the end of a "contentious" meeting on trade disputes. Most G-7 members remain furious with Trump over his decision to impose tariffs on aluminum and steel imports, and his threats to impose more trade restrictions. Merkel responded positively to Trump's suggestion, saying she would consider it.

"We should at least consider no tariffs, no barriers – scrapping all of it," Trump said, according to officials who were listening and taking notes.

Before [leaving for his meeting with Kim Jong Un](#), Trump [provided an update during a live press conference](#) with Larry Kudlow and John Bolton. First he thanked Trudeau and praised Canada as a "beautiful country" before launching into a summary of issues starting with trade. Though he walked away without signing the US on to the traditional post-summit agreement (providing more fodder for critics who sneered about the G-6 + 1), Trump insisted that the G-7 was "tremendously successful" and despite trade tensions "relationships are outstanding." He adds that the tariff situation is "going to change, 100 percent" as the US is "like the piggy bank that everyone robs".

During his talk, Trump alternated between stream-of-conscious rambling about trade, Russia and North Korea and taking

questions from reporters.

On trade:

"We had productive discussion on having fair and reciprocal" trade and market access.

"We're linked in the great effort to create a more just and prosperous world. And from the standpoint of trade and creating more prosperous countries, I think they are starting to be committed to more fair trade. We as a nation lost \$870 billion on trade...I blame our leaders and I congratulate leaders of other countries for taking advantage of our leaders."

"If they retaliate they're making a tremendous mistake because you see we have a tremendous trade imbalance...the numbers are so much against them, we win that war 1000 times out of a 1000."

"We're negotiating very hard, tariffs and barriers...the European Union is brutal to the United States...the gig is up...there's nothing they can say."

"We're like the piggy bank that everybody's robbing."

"I would say the level of relationship is a ten – Angela, Emmanuel and Justin – we have a very good relationship. I won't blame these people, unless they don't smarten up and make the trades fair."

On eliminating trade barriers:


"That's the way it should be. No tariffs, no barriers – no subsidies."

"You go tariff free you go barrier-free you go subsidy-free – that's the way we learned it at the Wharton School of Finance. We can't have an example where the US is paying fees

of 270%.”
