

# Del Bigtree Tests Air Quality of Breathing While Wearing a Mask on a Child, Proving Masks Are Toxic

Del Bigtree said that masks are not effective when they are not properly sealed and are re-used over and over again. Bigtree introduced his 11-year old son who wore an N95 mask and tested the carbon dioxide (CO<sub>2</sub>) levels inside of it that can cause toxicity or oxygen deprivation when CO<sub>2</sub> rises to 5000 ppm, which is the limit for daily workplace exposures, according to OSHA. The meter registered more than 10,000 ppm and stopped, all within a few seconds. A paper mask and a bandana both registered over 9000 ppm, and a plastic face shield registered at 1500 ppm. Indoor CO<sub>2</sub> air levels should be no higher than 1100 ppm inside of classrooms.
