

# Two Catholic Churches in San Diego Vandalized with Bizarre Messages

Two Catholic churches in San Diego were vandalized over the weekend. The graffiti messages that were spray painted on the walls and grounds included upside down crosses, pentagrams, BLM, Biden 2020, White Power, and Swastikas. The symbols represent conflicting messages. Surveillance video shows that the vandals were dressed in the standard black hoodies that is standard uniform for professional mercenaries associated with Antifa. Ironically, the conflicting symbols suggest that the perpetrators had no personal connection to their meaning. Over the past few weeks, the heads of the FBI and Department of Homeland Security have said that, while BLM and Antifa burn down buildings and commit violence, nevertheless, white supremacists are the biggest danger in America. [It is increasingly obvious that most if not all the violence and vandalism happening in America is theater to condition the minds of television viewers to believe their world is crumbling and that they must accept martial law and totalitarian government as the only way to restore tranquility. San Diego county sheriffs are investigating acts of vandalism at two Catholic churches in El Cajon.

Two churches in the El Cajon area were vandalized overnight with images of swastikas and other graffiti.

Saint Peters Chaldean Catholic Cathedral, 1627 Jamacha Way, was vandalized with spray-painted images of swastikas and political images, said Sgt. Michael Hettinger of the San Diego County Sheriff's Department.

Father Daniel Chaba of St. Peter's Chaldean Cathedral received the call of the incident around 8 a.m. Saturday.

The front walls of the church were covered in graffiti and politically charged

statements.

"I was disappointed, hurt," Father Chaba said, "we saw upside down crosses, we saw pentagrams, we saw BLM, we saw white power, we saw swastikas, we saw Biden 2020."

Deputies from the Rancho San Diego Station were alerted to the vandalism Saturday morning.
