

24 World Leaders Call for Global Treaty In Wake of Pandemic



Twenty four world leaders have signed a letter calling for more global government to combat future pandemics, led by UK prime minister Boris Johnson, German chancellor Angela Merkel, and French president Emmanuel Macron. The letter promotes a “global community” while urging an end to “isolationism and nationalism”. The letter specifically calls for a global treaty on pandemics to be signed to establish international ‘rules and norms’ for vaccine production and distribution, as well as coordination on ‘alert systems, data-sharing and research’. -GEG

Twenty four world leaders have signed a letter calling for more globalism to combat future pandemics, citing the the coronavirus outbreak as an opportunity to consign nationalism to the dustbin of history.

UK prime minister Boris Johnson, German chancellor Angela Merkel, and French president Emmanuel Macron are the leading figures behind the pledge, with 21 other heads of state signing the letter.

It states that “nobody is safe until everyone is safe,” and that a “global community” must be further implemented in order to combat ‘inevitable’ future pandemics.

“At a time when Covid-19 has exploited our weaknesses and

divisions, we must seize this opportunity and come together as a global community for peaceful cooperation that extends beyond this crisis,” the letter states.

“Building our capacities and systems to do this will take time and require a sustained political, financial and societal commitment over many years,” it adds.

The letter compares the situation to the aftermath of the Second World War, and urges an end to “isolationism and nationalism”.

The pledge calls for a strengthening of the World Health Organisation’s infrastructure, despite the global health body’s documented failures in regards to the pandemic, and continued charges that it has facilitated the communist Chinese government’s lies and deceptions.

WHO director general Dr Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus also signed the letter, having repeatedly slammed nations including Britain and the US for putting their own populations first when it comes to recovery.

Another Italian Professor is

Dead Following the AstraZeneca COVID Injection



The Italian press has reported on the AstraZeneca Covid injection-related deaths of two young professors, Ilaria Pappa from Ischia, Italy, and Zelia Guzzo from Gela, who died 12 days following taking the jab. There will be a criminal investigation into her medical records and the AstraZeneca vaccine. Earlier this month, another investigation was launched into AstraZeneca when a 57-year old music teacher died following the Covid injection. -GEG

As mass vaccination campaigns with experimental COVID injections now move on to the next demographic populations after beginning with senior citizens in assisted care facilities, and the healthcare workers in those facilities, the next targeted groups are educators.

We have seen multiple reports, for example, in the U.S. of entire school districts having to close down following a mass COVID injection campaign, as so many people get sick after the injections that there have not been enough employees in some school districts to hold classes right away following these massive injections.

Last week, I was informed of 3 deaths among faculty following COVID injections in one school district in Portland. But with nothing printed in the media and social media accounts silenced, I could not get collaborating evidence to publish those stories.

The Italian press, however, has now reported another death following the AstraZeneca COVID injection, a young professor from Gela, Italy. This follows our report from last week about 31-year-old Ilaria Pappa, a professor from Ischia, Italy, that The COVID Blog reported.

The professor from Gela is 37-year-old Zelia Guzzo. The Italian news publication quotidianodigela.it reports:

Zelia didn't make it. After 12 days the professor died.

Only a miracle could have saved her, changing a clinical picture that already last week had appeared irreversible. Shortly before eight o'clock last night it was ascertained that for Zelia Guzzo, 37 years old, there was nothing more to do.

The 37-year-old teacher leaves her husband, also a teacher, and a young son. A tragedy that has shocked the family and all the colleagues where Zelia worked and was appreciated.

Twelve days ago the young woman had felt ill and had been forced to hospitalization first in the hospital, then urgently to Sant'Elia of Caltanissetta. Conditions made very serious because her condition was affected by a cerebral hemorrhage.

Three weeks ago she had received the Astrazeneca vaccine as well as all teachers in the province.

She had been breathing artificially for a week.

The prosecutor's office of Gela has already started the first investigations to determine the possible causality with the vaccine she had received on March 1. A huge tragedy, which left in shock not only those who knew Zelia but the whole city.

Migrant Children in Foster Care Eligible for Permanent Residency in US



The website for the Los Angeles County Department of Children and Family Services says that migrant children who are in foster care may gain Special Immigrant Juvenile Status, have a pathway to become permanent residents, and receive welfare. The Biden administration is allowing huge numbers of unaccompanied children across the border and, thereby, gain new voters. -GEG

Current foster youth who are currently undocumented may have a pathway to lawful permanent resident status (“Green Card”) by qualifying for Special Immigrant Juvenile Status. Once the Juvenile Court has determined that a child meets the criteria for SIJS, a separate referral is made to SISU to begin the process.

In 2008, SIJS eligibility was expanded to include undocumented youth who meet the following criteria:

- Youth who are current dependents of the Juvenile Court
- Youth whose reunification with one or both parents is not viable due to abuse, neglect, abandonment or a similar basis found in state law
- Youth whose best interest it is NOT to return to his or

her country of nationality or last habitual residence.

- Youth who are unmarried and under the age of 21 in the United States.

Children who receive SIJS will not be at risk of deportation and may remain in the United States legally and provide them a pathway to permanent residency. SIJS also entitles children to qualify for state sponsored programs, financial aid, transitional housing, and other supportive programs.

*DCFS requests that any referrals be sent prior to the child's 18th birthday to ensure that the Predicate Orders are signed in sufficient time by the Dependency Court judge. Federal rules do not always accept Predicate Orders signed after the child reaches the age of 18.

Kirkland, Washington: The Friends of Youth, a non-profit organization that provides housing for foster children and services for homeless youth, kicked two foster parents and four minors out of the house it owns. One of the teens ran away after hearing about the impending eviction. The Friends of Youth is repurposing the house to accommodate “unaccompanied children” from the US-Mexico border. This report indicates that the Friends of Youth may be receiving funding from the federal Refugee Resettlement program. Research from the Center for Immigration Studies released in 2020 found that American taxpayers are billed up to \$133,000 per refugee resettled in America. -GEG
