



Mysterious Bank Jeffrey Epstein Created in the Virgin Islands Received \$15.5 Million After His Death

The New York Times reported that Jeffrey Epstein opened a mysterious bank in 2014 in the Virgin Islands that appeared to be stagnant for years until Epstein died and it suddenly received \$15.5 million dollars from his estate. It is unclear if the bank had any clients or actually conducted any business. The millions disappeared by then end of 2019. A judge who is overseeing Epstein's remaining assets of \$653 million has requested the estate to provide a full accounting of the missing money.

A mysterious bank Jeffrey Epstein opened in the Virgin Islands in 2014 – which has been seemingly stagnant for years – suddenly received millions of dollars from his estate after his death, the New York Times reported Tuesday.

The fallen billionaire and accused sex trafficker applied to open one of the territories' first international banking operations, Southern Country International, so he could chase the "dynamic discipline of international banking," according to an application for the institution, obtained by the outlet.

The application, where Epstein describes himself as one of the investment world's "pioneers," was ultimately approved in 2014

and allowed him to do business with offshore clients only, the outlet said.

While the bank renewed its license five times since then, it's unclear if it had any clients or actually conducted any business, until it received a windfall of cash from Epstein's estate after he died, the outlet reported.

The bank had \$693,157 in assets when Epstein died back in August and then, four months later in December, the estate transferred \$15.5 million to the bank in two separate checks. Southern Country then sent back \$2.6 million, leaving the total deposit at \$12.9 million, the outlet said, citing records filed by the estate last week.

By the end of the year, the millions were gone and the total assets at the bank were just below half a million dollars, the outlet said.

Jail Footage From Epstein's Suicide Attempt Two Weeks Before He Died was Reported

Missing, But Now Recovered!

Two weeks before Jeffrey Epstein was reported to have committed suicide by hanging on August 10th, he was found in his cell with injuries to his neck. His cellmate, Nicholas Tartaglione, a former police officer who was in custody awaiting trial in the drug-related gang-land slayings of four men in 2016, was accused of 'roughing up' Epstein, but later was cleared. The video from the first incident was reported missing – but now, it is reported that they have been found, although there is no word about what they reveal. Tartaglione, who is facing a possible death sentence, claims that he helped to save Epstein's life after he found him unconscious in their cell in the wake of the suicide attempt, and his lawyer wants to have access to the video to argue that he does not deserve the death penalty.

"It is our understanding...that the video no longer exists," Assistant U.S. Attorney Jason Swergold revealed on Wednesday. Manhattan, NY – Jail security footage from outside Jeffrey Epstein's cell from the day he attempted suicide have disappeared.

On Wednesday, Assistant U.S. Attorney Jason Swergold revealed that the footage is nowhere to be found – despite requests from his cellmate's attorney that the videos be retained, the New York Daily News reported.

Those requests were made two days after Epstein's unsuccessful suicide attempt on July 23.

It is unclear whether the cameras outside the cell were not working at the time of the incident, or whether the footage was erased, The Journal News reported.

"It is our understanding...that the video no longer exists," Swergold admitted to U.S. District Court Judge Kenneth Karas. "It was not preserved."

Karas told prosecutors to dig into what happened to the video.

Bruce Barket, the attorney for Epstein's former cellmate, Nicholas Tartaglione, said he was shocked to discover that jail officials hadn't safeguarded the footage, especially after he filed formal paperwork requesting that they do so, The Journal News reported.

Tartaglione, who is facing a possible death sentence in connection with a drug-related quadruple homicide, previously claimed that he helped to save Epstein's life after he found him unconscious in their cell in the wake of the suicide attempt, the New York Daily News reported at the time.

Tartaglione, a former Briarcliff Manor police officer, had shared a cell with the billionaire for about two weeks prior to the suicide attempt.

"Nick acted appropriately and admirably," Barket told the New York Daily News.

In the event the accused murderer is convicted, Tartaglione's defense team wanted to have access to the video to argue that he does not deserve the death penalty.

Katie Pavlich Ties ABC's Epstein Cover-Up To Clintons, Stephanopoulos

Florida: Palm Beach Sheriff Ric Bradshaw Investigates His Own Office for Privileges

Given to Epstein in 2003. Meanwhile, A State Senator Is Told to Back Off the Case

Florida Senator Lauren Book says she was warned to back off investigating the handling of Palm Beach Sheriff Ric Bradshaw's lenient work release program that was extended to Jeffrey Epstein. Bradshaw is investigating his own office for the lenient treatment of Epstein when he was granted work-release privileges and reportedly was visited by women behind closed doors in his home. Epstein was allowed to "work" from his home 12 hours per day, six days a week, during his prison term. Epstein's foundation paid Palm Beach County \$120,000 to cover the cost of deputies who escorted him back and forth and stood guard while he was in his office.

Florida Sen. Lauren Book has reached out to Capitol police after receiving an anonymous warning connected to her demand for a state inquiry into Palm Beach Sheriff Ric Bradshaw's handling of accused sex trafficker Jeffrey Epstein's lenient work release program, the Miami Herald has learned.

Book, a vocal advocate for child sexual assault survivors, said she also received more than a dozen calls from Bradshaw's political supporters asking her to back off on her call for an investigation by the Florida Department of Law Enforcement into Bradshaw.

On Monday, Book, a Democrat, wrote a letter to Republican Gov. Ron DeSantis asking him to authorize a probe into how Epstein, accused of molesting dozens of underage girls and a registered sex offender, was permitted to leave the Palm Beach County Jail and spend much of his 2008-2009 incarceration in an office in West Palm Beach.

DeSantis said Thursday after a Cabinet meeting that he would "certainly consider" an investigation but that he has yet to decide how the state should respond.

"I saw someone sent me a letter. I looked at it," he said. "I've got to figure out what the proper role of FDLE [is]. I know they are investigating it down in Palm Beach. ... Clearly when you look at how that happened, if even like 10 percent of the things about him are true, then that whole agreement was obviously suspect and willfully below what he should have faced."

While the governor was still weighing the merits of the senator's request, the Palm Beach Sheriff's Office issued a new statement that its previously announced internal affairs investigation of the deputies who guarded and supervised Epstein during his work release had become a criminal investigation as well. No further

elaboration was provided.

Meanwhile, Book, in an interview with the Herald, said she had asked the Capitol police, who handle security for state lawmakers, to look into claims made on a Russian website alleging that Bradshaw was behind an effort to access her phone and emails by using the pretext of "imminent danger" to obtain her personal information.

"I've received countless phone calls saying 'Little girl you don't know what you're getting into,' and telling me that I should just stop," said Book, a child sexual abuse survivor herself who has worked to pass strict sex offender laws in Florida.

In a statement, PBSO said it had no knowledge of anyone trying to threaten or pressure Book.

Report: Federal Attorney Alex Acosta Was Told that Jeffrey Epstein 'Belonged to Intelligence' and to 'Leave it Alone'

Labor Secretary Alex Acosta who, as US Attorney in Miami, oversaw the 2008 'sweetheart' plea deal with alleged sex trafficker, Jeffrey Epstein, reportedly told the Trump transition team he had been told to back off, that Epstein's activities were not to be investigated. "I was told Epstein 'belonged to intelligence' and to leave it alone." Many critics, including Ann Coulter, have speculated that Epstein, a former math teacher who is now reported to be worth \$2-billion, became wealthy by using young girls to blackmail powerful people, citing a victims' claim that he asked the girls to bring back reports on their liaisons, which sometimes were filmed. Coulter also pointed out that it is hard to believe that Epstein acquired his fortune as a hedge-fund manager. -GEG

Acosta told the Trump transition team when asked about his handling of Jeffrey Epstein's case that "I was told Epstein 'belonged to intelligence' and to leave it alone."

Epstein's name, I was told, had been raised by the Trump transition team when Alexander Acosta, the former U.S. attorney in Miami who'd infamously cut Epstein a non-prosecution plea deal back in 2007, was being interviewed for the job of labor secretary. The plea deal put a hard stop to a separate federal investigation of alleged sex crimes with minors and trafficking.

"Is the Epstein case going to cause a problem [for confirmation hearings]?" Acosta had been asked. Acosta had explained, breezily, apparently, that back in the day he'd had just one meeting on the Epstein case. He'd cut the non-prosecution deal with one of Epstein's attorneys because he had "been told" to back off, that Epstein was above his pay grade. "I was told Epstein 'belonged to intelligence' and to leave it alone," he told his interviewers in the Trump transition, who evidently thought that was a sufficient answer and went ahead and hired Acosta. (The Labor Department had no comment when asked about this.)

[...] In 2007 and 2008, as the FBI prepared a 53-page indictment that would charge Epstein with sex crimes, Epstein's powerful legal team played the influence card.

After the one meeting with then-U.S. Attorney Acosta, where presumably "intelligence" was mentioned, the indictment was shelved and, instead, Epstein signed a non-prosecution agreement with federal prosecutors, pleading guilty to one count of solicitation of prostitution and one count of procurement of minors for prostitution, which earned him a cushy 13 months in county jail, from where he was allowed to leave to work at his office and go for walks.

US Judge Says Prosecutors Violated the Rights of Victims in Jeffrey Epstein Underage Sex Abuse Case. Trump's Sec'y of Labor and Robert Mueller Are Under Fire.

US District Judge Kenneth Marra ruled that in 2008, federal prosecutors in Florida violated the rights of victims by secretly reaching a non-prosecution agreement with wealthy financier, Jeffrey Epstein, who was accused of sexually abusing at least 60 of underage girls and recruiting them for prostitution. Epstein spent a mere 13 months in jail, paid financial settlements to victims and is a registered sex offender. The prosecutors failed to consult with the victims when negotiating the non-prosecution agreement, in violation of federal law. Judge Marra failed to overturn the agreement asked prosecutors and victims' lawyers to recommend in 15 days how to move forward, giving the guilty parties time to settle with the victims.

The Justice Department recently opened a separate investigation into the handling of the Epstein case to determine whether prosecutors committed professional misconduct. Alexander Acosta was the US attorney in Miami at the time and brokered the deal. He now sits in Trump's cabinet and is his Secretary of Labor. Special counsel Robert Mueller led the FBI when the deal was brokered and also has culpability.

There is a two-tier justice system, one for wealthy and

politically connected that allows them to evade accountability and punishment, and another for the public that denies justice for victims.

Pockets of the Future: Robert Mueller, Jeffrey Epstein and the FBI Connection

Ten years after convicted Palm Beach sex offender Jeffrey Epstein escaped federal charges in connection with allegations that he paid dozens of teenage girls for sex, the FBI last week released what appears to be an explosive explanation for what many have long described as a sweetheart deal.

“Epstein has also provided information to the FBI as agreed upon,” agents wrote in one of dozens of heavily redacted, decade-old memos that were unexpectedly and inexplicably posted on an FBI website known as “The Vault.”

The simple declaration stunned those who have been following the tortuous and celebrity-studded case for years. It rekindled talk that the billionaire's 2008 decision to plead guilty to state charges to make the federal investigation disappear was part of a cover up to protect Epstein's high-powered friends, including President Donald Trump, former President Bill Clinton and Britain's Prince Andrew.

"That sentence obviously means something but I, too, am at a loss as to what it really means," said attorney Brad Edwards, who for a decade has been trying to unravel the mystery of Epstein's plea deal. "If there was some cooperation I would have expected that we would have been told. However, nothing surprises me at this point."

In recent years, federal prosecutors have offered various explanations for why they agreed to drop the case they were building against the 65-year-old enigmatic money manager if he pleaded guilty to state prostitution charges. In court papers, they have said they wanted to get justice for Epstein's young victims but worried a jury wouldn't believe them.

So, they have said, they negotiated a deal, allowing Epstein to plead guilty in Palm Beach County Circuit Court to one count of soliciting a minor for prostitution and another charge of soliciting prostitution. In exchange, federal prosecutors agreed to close their investigation. They have said they had no idea Epstein would only serve 13 months of an 18-month sentence in a vacant wing of the county stockade – a cell he was allowed to leave 16 hours a day, six days a week.

While voicing dismay at his lax punishment, prosecutors have pointed out that the plea deal required Epstein to pay the roughly 30 young women who filed civil lawsuits against him. Further, they said his guilty pleas force him to register as a sex offender for the rest of his life, potentially protecting other girls from abuse in the future.

However, over the years, they have never suggested that Epstein provided them any information in return.

Like Edwards, two people close to the long-closed federal investigation said they were flummoxed by the sentence in the FBI's memo that was written in September 2008, roughly two months after Epstein pleaded guilty in state court.

“I have never, ever heard of Jeffrey Epstein cooperating in any sense of the word,” said one official, who requested anonymity because of the top role the person played in the investigation. “I am stumped. It’s totally out of left field.”

Another individual with ties to the case voiced similar views. Epstein may have been required to talk to FBI agents but it’s unlikely he offered anything that would incriminate others, said the person, who declined to be identified because of ongoing efforts to help Epstein’s victims challenge the plea deal. “I don’t think he ever told the truth,” the person said.

Trump's Labor Chief Alexander Acosta Loses Chance at AG Appointment over Weak Prosecution of Sex Abuser Jeffrey Epstein

Jeffrey Epstein was accused by more than 40 victims of being coerced into a sex ring when they were underage girls, and he faced life in prison for his crimes, but he only served 13 months in jail in 2008. The federal prosecutor who made the 'sweetheart' deal for his release was Alexander Acosta. President Trump, who has known Epstein for many years, appointed Acosta as the US Secretary of Labor, which oversees human trafficking. -GEG

Last week, Alexander Acosta, the Trump-appointed Secretary of Labor, was knocked out of the running for the job as US Attorney General following a report in the Miami Herald about how Acosta, a former US attorney, gave billionaire Jeffrey Epstein an extraordinary plea deal in 2007 for sex crimes against numerous underage girls. Despite ample evidence from victims, Epstein served only 13 months in jail when he was facing charges that could have put him away for life. Acosta said he cut the sweetheart deal because he was under pressure by Epstein's superstar lawyers.

.
Epstein's case highlights the two-tier justice system for the wealthy and politically connected in contrast to justice served to average Americans.

.
The case is unusual, because Acosta granted immunity to "any

potential co-conspirators' under his non-prosecution agreement which extends to influential people who had sex with the underage girls. High profile people who have been linked to Epstein but not proven to have committed crimes, include Bill Clinton, Prince Andrew, Donald Trump, attorney Alan Dershowitz, actor Kevin Spacey, former national security adviser, Sandy Berger, former Colombian President, Andrés Pastrana, former Israeli prime minister Ehud Barak, and many others.

Acosta's deal was kept secret from the victims, which is against federal law. The deal was under a court seal until Epstein finished his jail sentence, thus, preventing victims from attempting to stop the deal.

.
On Tuesday, sex offender, Jeffrey Epstein, struck a last-minute deal to avoid a civil trial that would have allowed some of his victims to testify against him in court. The deal included a confidential financial settlement and an apology from Epstein to victims' attorney Bradley Edwards, who had accused Epstein of trying to ruin his reputation as retaliation for having represented his accusers. Epstein's statement reads, "I am now admitting that I was wrong and that the things I said to try to harm Mr. Edwards's reputation as a trial lawyer were false. I sincerely apologize for the false and hurtful allegations I made." The apology offered no words of remorse for Epstein's alleged victims, several of whom had been expected to testify in the trial.
